













Impact.

Community Impact Grants and Mini-Grants

Developed in accordance with the Massachusetts Attorney General's Community Benefits Guidelines, Fallon Health's **Community Impact Grants and Mini-Grants** programs support like-minded non-profit organizations and agencies in its service area by helping to fund programs that are aligned with the organization's funding priorities. In 2023, priority was given to programs working to **address health care inequities**, **reduce barriers** and **improve health outcomes**.



This generous grant from Fallon Health will help us to better serve the community during a time when food insecurity continues to increase. Through our volunteer farming program, we connect more than 6,000 volunteers to the important mission of Community Harvest Project, as they grow, tend, and harvest more than 315,000 pounds of produce for local hunger relief agencies. Together, we can ensure that the individuals and families experiencing hunger in Greater Worcester receive the nutritious produce they need to thrive.

Employee engagement

Throughout the year, Fallon Health's employees demonstrated that their compassion and generosity knew no bounds. They **volunteered** to build homes, stock food pantries, and serve meals. They **donated** money to support their local United Way. They **organized** fundraising walks and food drives.

In 2023, Fallon Health employees donated more than 6,426 volunteer hours at dozens of organizations.
